



Robert Ganley, Vice President Sergeants Benevolent Association

Robert Ganley began his law enforcement career with the New York City Transit Police Department. He was assigned to Districts 1, 4 and 23. He became a Transit PBA delegate and shortly thereafter the Queens Trustee. He was a member of the Political Action Committee, Constitution and Bylaw Committee, and the Contract Negotiations Committee.

After being promoted to sergeant, Bob was assigned to District 33 and District 2 and was appointed Executive Secretary of the Transit SBA. He served as Chairman of the Transit Police Superior Officers Variable Supplement Fund and as a Trustee of the Health and Welfare Fund. He was elected President of the Transit Police SBA. When the Transit and Housing police departments were merged with the NYPD, Bob spearheaded a lawsuit against the City of New York and then Mayor Giuliani on the issue of the 1127 Commuter Tax. The lawsuit was successful, and the City was required to reimburse members thousands of dollars, plus interest, which was unlawfully withheld.

Bob's memberships and affiliations include the NYPD Emerald Society, which honored him as their "Man of the Year" in 2007, the NYPD Emerald Society Pipes and Drums, NYPD Honor Legion, State of New Jersey Police Honor Legion, Fraternal Order of Police, International Police Association, Long Island Shields and the Knights of Columbus. He has also been a member of the Board of Directors of the Deborah Hospital Foundation since 2003.
